



D-Day Conneaut Veteran Program FAQs

What is D-Day Conneaut? It's a free living history event reenacting the Normandy Invasion on June 6, 1944.

Where is it located? Conneaut Township Park in Conneaut, Ohio. The street address is 480 Lake Road, Conneaut, Ohio 44030. Maps to our parking areas can be found on our visitor information page ddayohio.us/travel-info.htm.

What is the Veteran Hospitality Area and Tent? This serves as our assembly point for greeting and serving attending veterans. Check in and pick up your pin and join us for light refreshments provided by New Leaf Church and the Conneaut American Legion. The tent serves as the stage for the Veteran Oral History program, a pick up and drop off point for transportation services, and our "mess area" for the Veteran Luncheon.

What is the schedule of activities and highlights? Veteran activities on Friday feature morning and afternoon Veteran Oral History speaking programs. A Luncheon for WWII and Korean War era veterans, along with a guest, is provided free of charge. After lunch, veterans and their families are invited to travel to the marina to ride aboard a WWII landing craft. Friday activities conclude with recreated combat actions at Sword Beach (3:00 PM) and Foucarville (5:00 PM). Reserved seating is available to veterans and a guest, with priority being given to WWII and Korean War era veterans and veterans with limited mobility.

On Saturday, reserved seating is available for the Kellam's Bridge at La Fiere recreation at 10:00 AM. The Veterans Salute program starts at 11:30 AM and features the presentation of the French Legion d'honneur. An additional session of Veteran Oral History presentations takes place from 12:45 PM to 2:00 PM. Then, at 3:00 PM, the amphibious landing recreation begins. WWII and Korean War era veterans are invited to conclude their day at D-Day Conneaut by joining us for dinner and a USO style show. More information is available at ddayohio.us/schedule.htm.

How do I get around at the event? D-Day Conneaut is 100% wheelchair and scooter accessible. Transportation to and from the parking area and within the park runs continuously during event hours. Handicapped accessible restrooms are located in the parking area, Veteran Hospitality Area and throughout the park.

I'm not a WWII or Korean War era veteran, can I still attend? Absolutely! Any veteran from any era is welcome! At this time special services and recognition are extended to WWII and Korean War era veterans due to limitation on seating space and other resources. Any veteran who checks in with us at the Veteran Hospitality Tent will be recognized with a service pin or ribbon.
